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HOW TO USE

Use this morpheme matrix to help your students practice forming and spelling words with the base element, AUD.

Begin by teaching the root. Here is a possible script for teaching the base element, AUD.

1. (Write "aud" on the board.)
2. Our new base element is "aud". Let's read it together. (aud)
3. AUD is related to a Latin word which means *hearing, listening, or sound*.
4. (Write "audible" on the board.)
5. Watch me scoop the parts as I read this word.
6. (Scoop your hand under the parts as you read the word aloud.)
7. The word is AUDIBLE. It means *able to be heard*.
8. (Post the following words on the board for all to read in unison as you scoop your hand under each word part.)
 - audible
 - audience
 - audiovisual
 - audit
 - audition
 - auditor
 - auditory
 - inaudible

Make sure all children can see the morpheme matrix or have their own copy. Show them how to use the matrix to build words with the base element, AUD.

Students can work alone or in partners to build and record as many words as they can.
