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## **HOW TO USE**

Use this morpheme matrix to help your students practice forming and spelling words with the base element CEPT.

Begin by teaching the base element. Here is a possible script for teaching the base element CEPT.

- 1. (Write "cept" on the board.)
- 2. Our new base element is "cept." The base element CEPT comes from a Latin word meaning to take.
- 3. (Write "accept" on the board.)
- 4. Watch me scoop the morphemes as I read this word.
- 5. (Scoop your hand under the parts as you read the word aloud.)
- 6. The word is ACCEPT. It means that you have received something. In a way, you have taken something for yourself.
- 7. (Post the following words on the board for all to read in unison as you scoop your hand under each morpheme.)
  - acceptable
  - concept
  - exception
  - receptive
  - interception

Make sure all children can see the morpheme matrix or have their own copy. Show them how to use the matrix to build words with the base element CEPT.

Students can work alone or in partners to find and record as many words as they can.

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Use the matrix to write as many word sums as you can.
